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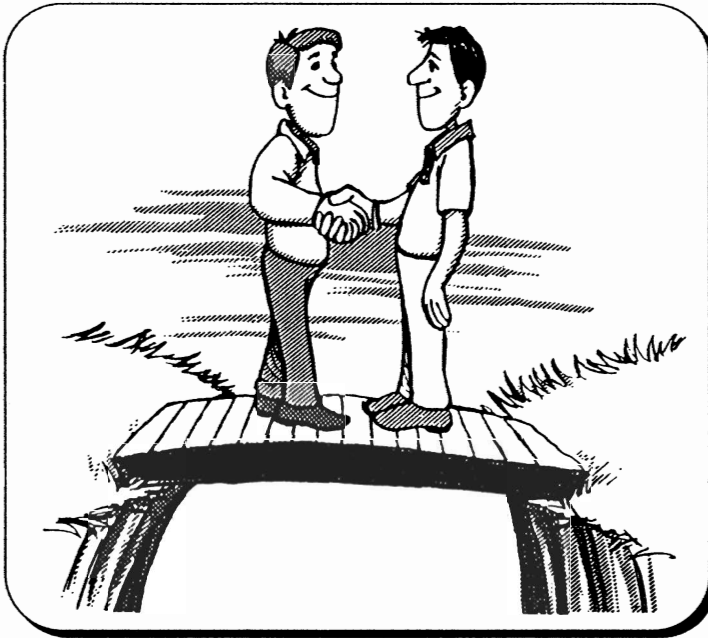

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GET ALONG ABILITY PART 3 A STRONGER RELATIONSHIP WITH OTHERS

This is our third and last part in a series to help us improve our relationships. In the last article we wrote about having a closer relationship with God. If that relationship is a close one it will directly affect all other relationships in your life. Your fellowship with God through prayer and hearing His Word will sweeten your spirit. With that type of spirit it's hard to have problems with those around us. It gives us so much more "getalongability" as I've called it. More of the love of God in your heart will build the bridges to better relationships.



Do you know Jesus was young also? Do you know he was a teenager at one time, just like you? This is what the scripture says of Him. "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and Man." Luke 2:52. He is our ultimate example. Jesus has set a

goal for all of us young people to reach. "Favor with God and man." The following paragraphs deal with all the different relationships we have as young people. I pray that you'll take these things to heart.

CONFLICTS

As we grow and get older, sometimes we will encounter conflicts with people. Conflicts are not pleasant things. Fighting is not a pleasant thing. It actually hurts deeply. The most vulnerable place for the devil to bring conflict is between a parent and teenagers. Maybe some of you young people get along great with everyone else, but with mom and dad, it's World War III. We should never think it's normal for this to happen and just accept it. I think we should seek God and pray to live higher than what the world calls normal. We should desire the very best in our relationships and experience as little conflict as possible.

PARENTS

Family conflicts can be the most severe sometimes. Maybe everybody knows each other too well or more specifically the devil knows us too well. He can bring such tension between family members, cause fights and hurtful words, and leave roots of resentment and bitterness in someone for years. The scripture says Satan has come to "steal, kill and destroy". Let's never forget the real culprit for destroying family's is Satan himself. He hates unity. He hates sweet fellowship. He hates oneness. Speaking of oneness, this is

what Brother Branham said in "Oneness with God" 1962. **"Any man and his family, a correct, good, noble, obedient family is one with another, any family. And if there's something in the family that moves them apart, then it's not right, the family's broken somewhere. They should all be one, father with mother, mother with father, children with parent, parent with children, all in agreement. And, when you see that, you'll see one lovely picture. That's Gods purpose."**



Notice our prophet said when something moves them apart it's not right. One time Rebekah, as a teenager, got mad and slammed the door at Brother and Sister Branham because they did not want her spending time with one particular girl. Brother Branham said, "that was the devil". This may be hard to swallow for some of you but that's what he said. It's not just a problem. Reactions like slamming a door show you're yielding to Satan and not to the Lord. It's an evidence of rebellion, as the prophet said. The devil causes reactions like that.

Who are these two people that we call our parents anyway? Why did God set things up that we would be raised and instructed by a mother and father for the first part of our life? They are not just another male and female on earth. They have been given to you from God, as you have been given to them from god. Sometimes we wish we could have had

different parents or been born in a different family, but God foreordained a plan for your life and these two people called your parents are one of the greatest parts of that plan. They will reveal a mystery that's in God of fatherhood and motherhood. As you get older you'll meet the real Father. You'll come under His headship and leadership. Until then, God set it up that your parents will lead you. If you look at things like this, you'll no doubt change your attitude toward your parents. It brings a reverence in your heart for them. Remember, God has given them to you. I like to think of it this way. God has set up a kind of practice session for living under headship. You are in that practice session now. Before having a Heavenly Father to guide you someday, He gave you parents to prepare for that relationship coming. How comfortable you become with your parents headship and leadership is how comfortable you'll be with God's. They are very much tied together.

The Bible gives only one main instruction about our relationship with our parents. **OBEY THEM!** Proverbs' 1:7-9, Ephesians 6:1-3, Colossians 3:20. Even if it doesn't look like it sometimes, they love you. They were a young person once. Give them a break. Let them know that you love them. Most youth try to get their way by rebelling. Why don't you try God's way? Dare to be different.

Another key I'd like to add to help improve your relationship with them is this. The Bible says for fathers not to provoke your children to anger. That means that a father, if he wants, can push all the wrong buttons and bring out the worst in a child. He can stir or provoke more anger. Could it be that the same principle applies to us and our parents? They know how to push the wrong buttons on us and bring out our worst, but we know our parents buttons too. We can bring out their worst. What we all should seek to do is push the right buttons to bring out the best in everyone, including our parents. Obeying your father and mother when

they tell you to do something is pushing the right button. Just watch how many more liberties and freedoms can come from showing your obedience and responsibility to their leadership. The way of rebelling will lead to more and more conflicts and less and less freedom.

To end this section on our relationship with our parents I will give you some tips to try. These tips are not mine. They are all suggestions from young people like you that were given to me in a local youth meeting. I think they are pretty good.

1. Spend time with them and get to know them real good.
2. Talk to them about a serious issue or questions at a good time, not when everyone is hyper or tense.
3. Respect their decisions even when you don't understand. God speaks through your parents.
4. Say sorry when you're wrong. Admit it.
5. Tell them I Love You often.
6. Write them a note, card or something expressing your appreciation.
7. Become friends with your parents, not just family.
8. Give them a nice big hug every once in a while.

Your parents deserve your utmost respect because the Word of God requires it. They also deserve respect because they are older and more experienced. May God bless you in your relationship with your parents. They are not your enemies. They are gifts of God.

BROTHERS AND SISTERS

Conflicts in families can be between sisters and brothers. If you've never had an argument with any of your brothers or sisters then congratulations. I don't know how you

did it. Tension can get pretty heavy sometimes with a sister or brother. Most of the time it's over a very small issue, like when my brother used to borrow my socks. His didn't seem to be good enough so he just helped himself to



mine. My socks, become a very heated issue at times, mainly because I never ever seen them again after he "borrowed" them. Today it seems so stupid and I still laugh at what we

made such huge issues over. Selfishness is no doubt the word to describe why most of these conflicts arose, but they did. Brothers and sisters argue over curlers, food, clothes, bedroom territory, and all kinds of other things. It's not good, but it happens sometimes. Even in the scripture, we find examples, such as Jacob and Esau. Brother Branham spoke of The Branham Family fighting with each other in the backyard and fighting for each other in the front.

As I said earlier, families know each other almost too well. It's easy for brothers and sisters to always bring out each others' weakness' instead of strengths. To get along requires a respect to be maintained for one another. It's important to concentrate on each others good areas, instead of the bad. Many times you'll have more respect for other people than members of your own family. Proverbs' 24:23 "...It is not good to have respect of persons..." . Something is wrong when you are so friendly with every one else and mean to a brother or sister.

Jesus said "*blessed are the peacemakers*". That's a good scripture to apply at home. Be a peacemaker. Treat your brothers and sisters the way you want to be treated. God will bless that effort. Here are some other scriptures I'll

leave with you. May you seek God to get along with your other family members.

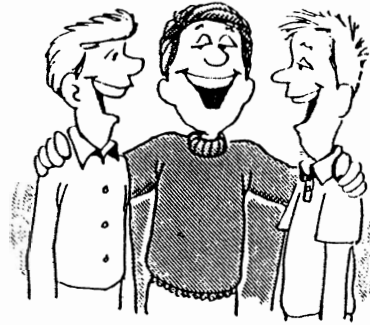
Matthew 12:25 *"And Jesus knew their thoughts, and said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation: and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand."*

Romans 12:10,18 *"Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honor preferring one another; If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men."*

I John 4:7-8 *"Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love."*

FRIENDS AND PEERS

We all need friendships. Fellowship is important for every human being. We truly need companionship, but we don't need bad companionship. True friends are ones who lead us closer to God. One of the benefits to this life, as we get older, is making our own choices. One of the most important choices outside of your choice to serve God is choosing what kind of company to hang around with. We must choose wisely who will influence our life. Proverbs' 13:20 says, *"He that walketh with wise men shall be wise: but a companion of fools shall be destroyed."* If you also read Proverbs 1:10-18, you'll see the wrong influence of hanging around the wrong crowd. Be real choosy of your companions. You might meet someone at school or elsewhere that has a really cool personality, but that's not the basis of choosing a friend. If you have dedicated your life to God, you can't expect to get along perfectly with someone who hasn't. It just doesn't mix. *"Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness?..."* II Corinthians 6:14. It just never works out to



your good. James 4:4 says you can't be a friend with the world and God at the same time. Pick the right friends. That's the first step in getting along good with peers. Serving the Lord will automatically give you things in common. That kind of fellowship is best.

Real friendships are of the Lord. Brother Branham said, "You can't buy friendship with money. Friendship is a gift of God." How wonderful it is to experience a close friendship with a Godly friend. There's nothing like it. To have a close friendship you must always be honest and treat that person the way you would want to be treated. Here's a wonderful verse to end this subject of friends. Proverbs' 18:24 says *"A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly: and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother."*

THE OPPOSITE SEX

Guess what? Out of the wholesome Godly friendships you develop might come the special someone you would marry. A good candidate for a husband or wife is someone you have become close friends with and know their walk with God is solid. It's better to get to know someone while they are around the saints and with their family, rather than alone. I know many young people think just the opposite. They say, "I need to be alone with him or her to get to know them better." Why is that? Is there a difference in their actions and conversation while they are alone? There shouldn't be. What you want to know is what kind of person they really are. You want to see their character. The truth is that these qualities are best displayed in their everyday life with friends and family. Please don't misunderstand. There is a correct courtship that will no doubt

include time to talk with just one another, but when young people are so set on being alone so much with their girlfriend to "get to know them" it sounds fishy. If you're seeking a Godly courtship that reflects all the purity of scripture, you'll have nothing to hide and nothing will be sneaky. Your fellowship and conversations alone would fit also in groups of young people and his/her family. This is the right way. So many of us in this generation fail to seek this way because we've bought too much of Hollywood's dating instead of God's courtship.

Anyway, I have said enough about that. Maybe in a later issue of Youth Quake we'll deal in depth again on Godly courtship. Nevertheless seeking God's way will certainly strengthen and make for better relationships with the opposite sex. It provides a freedom to speak with girls or guys about the Lord and other things without the crazy little games and lustful spirits floating in the minds of youth. Many young people tell me, "I wish there could be just good wholesome fellowship without the worry of someone trying to push themselves on you to get into something serious". Some fellows and girls only have a one track mind when it comes to being with a member of the opposite sex. They want to get serious with someone right away. Some young people go to a youth camp for just that reason alone. How pathetic! There's certainly no better place to find a mate than around the true Word being preached, but to go only for that reason shows your spiritual weakness.

Young people, we must live by faith and not fear. Hebrews' 11:6 says, "*But without faith it is impossible to please him:...*" I John 4:18 says, "*There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: ...*" Apply these scriptures to the subject of fellowship with the opposite sex. It will keep you from bondage and fear. As instructed by Paul in I Corinthians 7:1, single young people should keep

themselves pure and reserved for that one mate until the wedding day.

Only in following this way is there true freedom and strong fellowship with brothers and sisters.

TEACHERS/EMPLOYERS

Our relationships with employers and teachers can be difficult sometimes because they are unsaved. Nevertheless, the Bible gives us some very good instructions to help us. Colossians 3:22-24 "*Servants, obey in all things your masters according to the flesh; not with eyeservice, as menpleasers; but in singleness of heart, fearing God: And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men; Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ.*" I believe a key for us in verse 23 is to do what we do as unto the Lord, not unto men.



As Christians, we serve God in everything we do. Our school, our work, and our play revolve around our purpose to express Christ to this world.

If you think you're working at a place just for a pay check, you're wrong. God has you there to be a light and while you're at it, you can make money; but the real purpose is to serve the Lord there too. Clearly we couldn't possibly treat an employer or teacher bad without messing up our relationship with God.

Remember we do it as unto the Lord. Christians should be the best workers an employer could find. Christians should also be the best students a teacher would have. Our life should example faithfulness, respect, punctuality, honesty, commitment, discipline, purity, dedication, and more specifically the life of Christ. Why? Were doing what we do "heartily" (with all of our heart) unto the Lord. Unless an employer/teacher instructs us to do something against our faith, we should obey them in everything as the scripture has said. God's eyes are on us at work or school. You can't be rebellious to these instructors and think God doesn't see it. He does. Part of your obedience to God is your obedience to your leaders. Here are some more scriptures to read and something the prophet said. "Warning Then Judgment" 1963; **"We are responsible, and God has put us here on the earth for a reason, and that reason he has put us here for, we are responsible for that reason. You should go to Him and find out what He wants you to do . If you went to work out to the barn and just set down our there, and say, "Well?" See you must go ask Him what He wants you to do, and then do it. If your working for a man, find out what your duties is. And then if our life is on the earth here, then we should go to the one who put us here, and "Lord, what would you have me to do? What must I do? Why am I here?"** Ephesians 6:5-8, Matthew 22:21.

PASTOR/BELIEVERS

Most of you reading this paper have a local church and pastor believing this End Time Message. Don't ever take for granted the blessing of this. We can't deny that there are some false ministry today that have messed up either in teaching or their lives. But don't ever let that make you doubt, God has real ministers, truly called and ordained to lead us.

Ephesians 4:11-13 says, *"And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:"* God gave these gifts for a help. The prophet said, **"Stay with your pastor. See? He's the shepherd and you give him respects. He will lead you through and cause he's ordained to do so."** Respect the man God has placed over you. Respect his position. Support his ministry with



all your heart. Take notes, be faithful to services, and back him up with your "amens". This gives great encouragement to the ministry. Always remember they are human, but the gift in them is of God. Go to him with your questions and concerns. Pray and ask God to use the Gift he has provided for leadership in your life. The Bible says in Hebrews 13:7, *"Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the Word of God: whose faith follow, considering the end of their conversation."* Sometimes a pastor may have to really rebuke the church. Sometimes it appears as though he's rebuking just you, but that's Gods gift keeping us on track. God's love is expressed in their correction from the Word of God. Pray for him. That man has one of the hardest positions in our age. He needs your prayers.

If he's a true minister, he will always be open to help guide you in concerns you have. Don't be afraid to talk to him, he's not your enemy. He's your brother.

As far as the saints at church, get around the ones you feel are closest to God. Surround yourself with the wisdom, fellowship, and counsel of the believers. You don't always have to be with other young people. Sometimes it's good to sit around and listen to some who have been through some battles and know how to tackle this enemy we fight against. Getting loaded up with good wisdom and instruction from these role models will give you the upper edge on the devil in your growing years.

Young people, I pray that you have been encouraged in some of these areas. Living life



in the Lord is the most wonderful life to live. May you all grow to the place that your getalongability is improved in all aspects of your life. May you, as Jesus did, grow in favor with God and man.

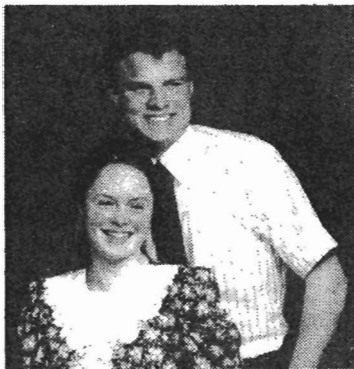

THE VOICE OF THE SEVENTH ANGEL IN JEFFERSONVILLE ON SPRING STREET, 1995

On September 8-10, 1995 the voice of the seventh messenger sounded for approximately twenty-eight hours on the corner of Court Ave. and Spring St. in Jeffersonville, Indiana.

The congregation of Open Bible Fellowship of Living Word Believers, shared the burden of their pastor, Brother Ken Andes, and once again shared the Message with the people of Southern Indiana. This is the third year that the congregation has erected a booth on Spring Street in Jeffersonville, to

participate in a city-wide festival called Steamboat Days.

On Friday morning, September 8, the brothers from the assembly created a booth with a banner displaying, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today, and forever," as well as, "Jesus Christ is the revealed Word," "God reveals His secret unto the prophets," "I will send you Elijah the prophet," "Elijah truly shall first come and restore." Also, hundreds of Brother Branham's printed messages were distributed.

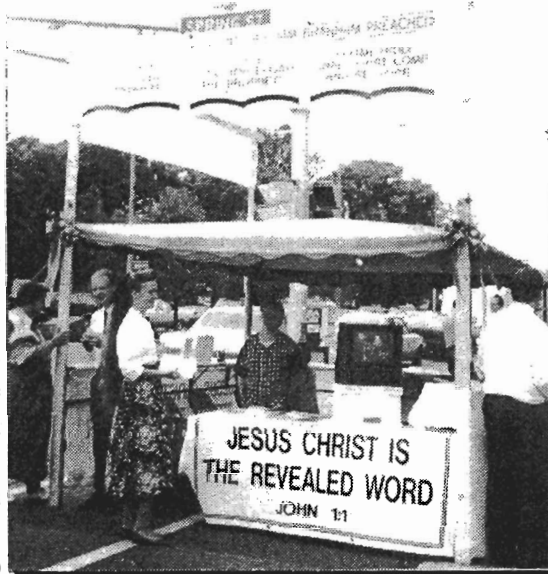
The Believers from the assembly were scheduled to come at different times, and each personally handed out Message Introduction Cards, and an article of what Brother Branham has said about Spring Street. For example: "I seen the 1937 flood rise, and twenty-two feet come over Spring Street, begin to prophesy. People said, 'you're crazy. you're off at head.' Down at the Falls City Transfer Company, when I gave that down there to them, they said, 'Ah, Billy, go on home.' But less than six weeks from then, twenty-two feet of water measured over Spring Street, just exactly the way It said." And, also, of the 1933 baptismal, when he

was commissioned to forerun Christ's Second Coming.

Over five thousand Message Introduction Cards were personally handed to individuals, plus two thousand "Ohio River & Spring Street" fliers. A video constantly showed Brother Branham preaching, *The Twentieth-Century Prophet*, and *Deep Calleth to The Deep*, screaming out across

the area, while people of all classes, races, creeds, passed by and heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The responses of the people were varied. Some people commented that they had known "Billy", went to school with him, dated him, was related to him, and went to his meetings in the 30's, 40's, 50's and 60's. One lady, present at the foot of Spring street the day the Pillar of Fire came down, described what she had seen, how she felt, and



the reaction of the people standing on the bank, as she visually witnessed this 1933 event. Every person that said they knew Brother Branham spoke of him a gentleman, very respectful of the women, and a fine man.

The young people of Open Bible Fellowship of Living Word Believers are much stronger in what they believe because of expressing such a positive witness to so many people. The local newspaper headlines were "Festival draws tens of thousands to Jeffersonville."

We believe that many hearts were touched by the efforts of the individual believers. They gave unreservedly, stood till their feet ached, shoulders were numb, and bone-tired. But the Gospel continues to go forth in Jeffersonville, and the city continues to be without excuse.

- to take up our cross and follow Jesus. The challenge that remains with us is not that of bearing our cross just while at camp but of taking it up

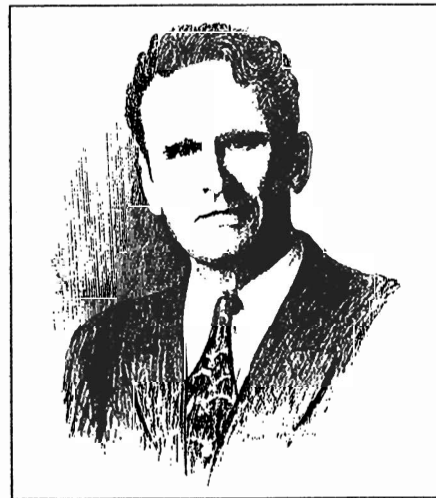
daily in the ordinariness of our lives.

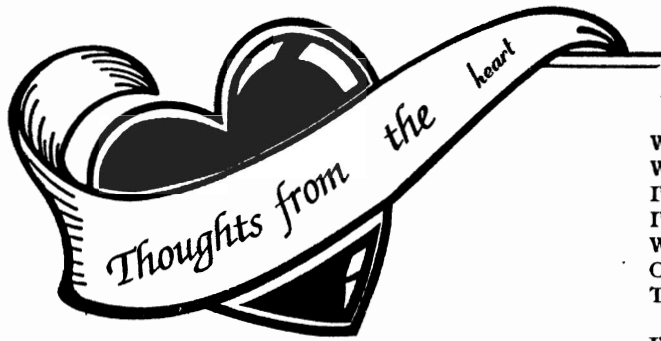
